English LA Standard 3.W.6.1

This week's grammar skill focuses on plural possessive nouns. Students will be able to identify and correctly use both singular and plural possessive nouns. There will be a quiz on Friday. The following week will be a review of nouns and then we will move on to verbs. We are also working on writing a complete paragraph with a topic sentence and supporting details.

Plural Possessive Nouns

To show that more than one person, place, or thing <u>owns something</u>, use a plural possessive noun.

Add an apostrophe (') to plural nouns that end in -s, -es, or -ies to make them possessive (show ownership).

Plural Noun Birds build their own nests.
Plural Possessive Noun Birds' nests are different from one

another.

To make <u>irregular plural nouns possessive</u> add an apostrophe and the <u>letter s ('s)</u> to make it possessive (show ownership).
