
## Mrs. Phillips' Weekly Focus April 8th- 12th, 2018

**Reading:** (Standards 3.RF.5, 3.RI2, 2.RL3, 3.RL4, 3.RV.2, 3.RV.3, 3.W.6)

This week we will continue reading the novel Charlotte's Web. This week we will read chapters 5-8. All reading will be done in class. We will be answering comprehension questions and doing character studies in class. Please do not have students read ahead in the book at home. We will be doing work which requires them to base their answer on what has happened so far in the book. If they read ahead, it could change the way they answer the question. There will be Quiz over Chapters 4-5 on Tuesday. All quizzes are open book. Information on the end of book project was sent home Monday, April 8th. Those projects are due May 6th.



Please encourage students not to watch the movies (there are three versions), as they do not follow the book and could negatively affect how they answer comprehension questions.

## <u>Adverbs</u>

An <u>adverb</u> is a word that can tell **when**, **where**, or **how** something happens. **Adverbs** describe **verbs**.

<u>Yesterday</u>, the family moved into a new home. (when)
They carried boxes <u>inside</u>. (where)
They <u>happily</u> unpacked the boxes. (how)

- Adverbs can come before or after the verbs they describe.
- Adverbs that tell how something happens often end in -ly.
- Related sentences can be joined by using an adverb.
   Jane packed her clothes. She was sad.
   Jane sadly packed her clothes.

This week's spelling list (#27) deals with the spellings au, augh, ou, and ough. Most students have the 20 words, some have a shortened list of 15 and some have an extended list of 25.
